

Dr. J. A. Campbell Research Award Overview

Grants in Aid of Research in Celiac Disease, Dermatitis Herpetiformis and/or Gluten Sensitivity in Canada Award



A grant of up to **\$25,000** is offered by the Canadian Celiac Association for research projects in Canada of a scientific, applied science, and/or medical nature relevant to celiac disease, dermatitis herpetiformis, and/or non-celiac gluten sensitivity, or the socio-economic implications of delayed diagnosis and/or living with these conditions. This year we have an interest in gluten aversions in vulnerable populations, however applications are not limited to this subject area.

Purpose

This award is to encourage research and further the understanding of the full range of implications of celiac disease (gluten-induced enteropathy), dermatitis herpetiformis, and/or non-celiac gluten sensitivity.

Application

Completed applications must be received by the Canadian Celiac Association no later than February 14, 2020, and each will be acknowledged. These applications will be forwarded to the Professional Advisory Board of the Canadian Celiac Association for adjudication.

Adjudication

Applications will be judged by the Professional Advisory Board of the Canadian Celiac Association who will make decisions regarding based on the suitability and quality of the proposed work. The recommendation of the Professional Advisory Board will be forwarded to the Board of Directors of the Canadian Celiac Association for ratification.

Notification

The successful candidate will be formally notified by **April 28, 2020**.

Award

Payment and Reporting for the Award are governed by CCA's 'Payment and Reporting Guidelines'. Generally, grants are payable in two (2) installments. The first installment (80% of the award) will be paid upon receipt or notice from the investigator of ethics approval, and that the project is ready to start. The second installment (20%) will be paid upon receipt of a satisfactory final report.

Publicity and Access

The Award recipient is expected to present the work following its completion at the next Annual General Meeting of the Canadian Celiac Association (usually held in May) with expenses to attend this meeting covered by the Canadian Celiac Association in accordance with CCA's Guidelines. Notwithstanding the author's rights to publication, the CCA shall be granted the right to publish the final report, whole or in part, in its publications including electronically.
